Description:

A basin mire with a small catchment. The peat is up to 2 metres deep near the centre. The surface is very wet with active growth of bog mosses *Sphagnum* spp. Several scarce plants occur, notably bog rosemary *Andromeda polifolia* near its most southerly known location in the British Isles. Others are royal fern *Osmunda regalis*, cranberry *Vaccinium oxycoccus* and petty whin *Genista anglica*. The latter grows on the drier western margin. Purple moor-grass *Molinia caerulea* dominates the drier edges of the site.
